The town, established in 1733, was named after King George II's daughter. History buffs, antique lovers, and anyone seeking the authentic Eastern Shore will enjoy exploring our quaint and historic town. Step back in time as you walk our graceful, tree-lined streets and brick sidewalks amongst carefully preserved Colonial, Federal and Victorian houses, churches and gardens. Unique shopping and dining experiences include the Washington Hotel, which has been serving travelers and townsfolk for over 200 years. And, as the county seat, Princess Anne is the ideal starting point for day trips around the Lower Eastern Shore.



You'll be Entertained, Amused and Informed

The free Princess Anne Heritage Cell Phone Tour makes our town's heritage and history come alive: Hear the stories of freemen and slaves, innkeepers, merchants and more.

The tour highlights over 300 years of the Town's history and heritage from the Colonial era, Revolutionary, Civil and World Wars, the heyday of steamboat travel, the arrival of the railroad and the Town's first "talking" picture show.

The free tour features 68 stories and 40 sites all within walking distance in the historic downtown. Available 24/7.
